Business meeting adjourned.


Show and Tell

TIP: Lint Remover

When you sometimes buy the end of bolt on fabric you get an end that has a lot of threads that you need to pick off or when you have to remove stiches from a block that you made a mistake on. I just use a Lint Remover roll to help me. I roll the lint remover all over the edge or fabric to pick up the little threads it makes my job so much easier and I sometimes use it on the floor to pick up threads that have fallen. TIP: Loose Threads

Keeping these pesky loose threads from finding a home on your clothes, floor and project can be kept under control by keeping a simple paper coffee filter next to your machine. As you clip the threads, just put them on the filter. It acts practically like a magnet for those little guys! When you're through with your work for the day, just pick it up and throw it away.

TIP: Washed or Not

As my fabric stash grows larger with splurges and leftover fabrics, it becomes harder to tell which fabrics have been washed and which haven't. I simply zig-zag the raw edges of fabric only when I'm going to wash them. So I know that the fabric that has been zig-zagged has been washed. Fabric that has no zig-zag hasn't been washed.

TIP: Easy roll binding

When binding a large quilt, I find that the binding starts to get tangled (even caught under the wheels of my sewing chair), so I now roll the binding around my finger and when completely rolled up, I place it into a sealable plastic sandwich baggie and put a slit in the bag just under the seal, (just large enough for the binding to fit through easily) and put the baggie in my lap. As you sew and need more binding it automatically just slides right out... no twisting or catching. Try it! I wish I had figured this out years ago.



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APRON CHALLENGE

Make and bring your favourite apron which will be judged by Viewer's Choice and then modelled during the program.

APRONS

I don't think our kids know what an apron is.

The principal use of Grandma's apron was to protect the dress underneath because she only had a few. It was also because it was easier to wash aprons than dresses and aprons used less material. But along with that, it served as a potholder for removing hot pans from the oven.

It was wonderful for drying children's tears, and on occasion was even used for cleaning out dirty ears.

From the chicken coop, the apron was used for carrying eggs, fussy chicks, and sometimes half-hatched eggs to be finished in the warming oven.

When company came, those aprons were ideal hiding places for shy kids. And when the weather was cold Grandma wrapped it around her arms.

Those big old aprons wiped many a perspiring brow, bent over the hot wood stove. Chips and kindling wood were brought into the kitchen in that apron.

From the garden, it carried all sorts of vegetables. After the peas had been shelled, it carried out the hulls.

In the fall, the apron was used to bring in apples that had fallen from the trees.

When unexpected company drove up the road, it was surprising how much furniture that old apron could dust in a matter of seconds.

When dinner was ready, Grandma walked out onto the porch, waved her apron, and the men folk knew it was time to come in from the fields to dinner.

It will be a long time before someone invents something that will replace that 'old-time apron' that served so many purposes and I never caught anything from an apron but LOVE!

Challenge Block (Please make 2 - 1 for a draw and 1 for Charity Quilt)



HANDS ACROSS THE WATER, SEPTEMER 27, 2014 "STITCHES IN TIME"

Hosted by the Sunshine Coast Quilters Guild, Sechelt, B. C.

Spool Block is the pattern – unfinished size 8 ½"

The Guild also wishes to make a Comfort Quilt from these blocks so we are requesting participants to make 2 blocks; one to contribute to the comfort quilt and one for the draw.

The background is white-on-white (tone on tone), the old fashioned wooded spools are medium brown colour and you choose the colour of "thread" you wish to depict (except white or the colour you choose for the 'spool'). Please use white or beige thread for machine sewing.

Fabric requirements for each block:

2 squares of white-on-white 3" x 3"

2 squares of medium brown 3" x 3"

2 rectangles of white-on-white 2 1/2" x 4 1/2"

2 rectangles of medium brown 2 1/2" x 4 1/2"

1 square of coloured fabric 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Place one 3" square of white on one 3" square of medium brown, right sides together. Draw a pencil line diagonally across. Stitch 1/4" each side of the drawn line. Cut on the drawn line and press the two squares toward the medium brown fabric. (See drawings below) Repeat this for the two remaining 3" squares. Square up the blocks to 2 1/2". These are the four corners in the block.

Place the remaining fabrics as shown below and sew the block together as you usually do.
