## Quilted iPad Sleeve



#### **FABRIC PREPARATION**

From lining fabric, cut: 1 - 8½" x 22" rectangle and 1 - 2" x 7½" rectangle

#### QUILTING

- 1. Layer batik fabric, batting and muslin fabric. Using a variety of threads, quilt as desired. You may need to adjust the tension of your machine with each different thread you use. Sample was quilted following the design of the fabric pattern, and then shadow stitched around quilted design. TIP: Play with a sample sandwich first using the same fabrics and batting as in your main project to make sure your tension is set correctly.
- 2. Trim quilted sandwich to 8½" x 21"

#### **BUTTON STRAP**

- 1. Fold the 2" x 7½" rectangle in half, lengthwise. Press to crease. Open fabric; fold one edge in to meet the crease. Press. Repeat for opposite side. Fold in half along original crease line; press.
- 2. Topstitch along long edges. Set aside.

#### **ASSEMBLY**

 Fold quilted sandwich in half, right sides together, aligning short edges at the top. Stitch along both sides, back stitching at beginning and end of seam. Trim corners to reduce bulk. A quick and fun project for any quilter, this iPad sleeve will take just a couple hours to make. The most difficult part will be deciding on the threads you want to use to quilt!

MATERIALS Finished Size: 8" x 10½" Difficulty Level: Beginner

10" x 23" batik fabric
10" x 23" muslin or other fabric
10" x 23" light batting
8½" x 24" coordinating fabric for
lining and button strap
Assorted metallic and other threads
for quilting
1 - 1" button

1/4" seam allowance is used

- 2. Fold lining in half, right sides together, aligning short edges at top. Stitch the full length along one side, backstitching at beginning and end of seam. Stitch along the opposite side, leaving a 3-4" opening for turning in the middle of the seam.
- 3. Turn lining pouch right side out. Place lining inside quilted pouch, right side of lining facing right side of quilted pouch and matching seams. Pin in place.
- 4. Fold button strap in half; place strap, loop side down, in between lining and quilted pouch making sure it is centred on one side of the pouch between the seams, and aligning raw edges of strap with raw edges of pouch. Pin in place.
- 5. Sew around the entire opening of pouch.
- 6. Turn right side out through the opening in the lining; press so that ¼" of the lining shows at the top of the sleeve opening. Stitch in the ditch, being careful not to catch the button strap in your seam.
- 7. Slipstitch opening in lining closed; tuck lining into sleeve. Sew button to front of iPad sleeve.

### Street Talk about the newest babies in town (Presented at HAW Sept 26/14)

Okay, I love new babies.... so can't resist stopping to chat with new parents when out about town. In the past few weeks, I had the opportunity to talk to three moms on the street. Seems like there has been a baby on every corner..... do you think there is a little baby boom here on the Sunshine Coast because people have heard about the baby quilts???? LOL.

Occasionally parents leave the hospital without their quilts AND boy do we hear about it!!! Our neighbour didn't get a quilt isn't that awful etc. So we have provided bright signs to be posted in the maternity ward.

After admiring the new baby (and any big brothers or sisters too), I ask if they received a quilt and here is just a bit of what I hear......

All had received a quilt – two before leaving the hospital

The visiting health nurse collected a quilt for the third baby

All three moms knew who had made their baby's quilt.... "Are you Karen? , Are you Gail? Are you Carol? I was really wishing I was Karen, Gail or Carol!!!

One woman told me she felt so cared for & spoiled when leaving the hospital with a quilt

"My husband & I grew up on the coast. We had our first baby for medical reasons in Vancouver. The whole experience having our second child at St. Mary's was so much more special. We felt so cared for."

A quilt is so special! We've never had one and never thought we'd ever have one

I'll keep that quilt for ever

It's so bright and cheerful and hand-made too. So special for us!

Thank you so much, It's amazing.

I'm going to write a thank you note when I have a minute – when the baby fog goes away

One woman with 2 other little ones at home told me that leaving the hospital was very stressful with so many things to remember and think about. She said she is surprised she remembered her baby!

Everyone was so grateful and so willing to talk. The quilts have been a **HUGE** hit, a real way to welcome our coastal babies!

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
## MISSION STATEMENT

## "Murder and Mayhem"

Come join the fun for a great retreat weekend! There are two planned classes, as well as the 'do your own thing' option, and an on-site vendor to meet your shopping needs. The retreat weekend includes two full days of classes, two evening programs, accommodations, and all meals and snacks. Cost for the weekend is \$370 with classes, or \$270 for the "do your own thing" option.

There is still room in both classes – it is not too late to sign up!!!

#### Teacher and Class Information

We are fortunate to have two fantastic teachers to join us at retreat this year; together they have 40 years of teaching experience to share with us. You may recognize Anna Buzzalino from her work with Quilting Arts, and though Hazel Wainwright may be new to most of us — she is a favourite teacher for many past students. What an inspiration they will be!

#### Workshop #1 Anna Buzzalino – Moments

Anna is a fibre artist and quilt instructor. Her present focus is on art quilts, incorporating different elements for surface texture. Anna's work has been featured in Quilting Arts Magazine and she regularly appears on the TV series. Her quilts have won several awards at local and national shows, and have been juried into major international shows.

Each student will work on their own piece to be finished at 17" x 24" approximately. The focus of the first day will be to design the piece based on a favorite object of inspiration (a photo, a leaf, shell, feather, piece of wood, cup, etc.). Once the design has been finalized, the piecing technique will be demonstrated. Quilting techniques will be discussed, as well as thread painting and embellishment: Paintsticks, Angelina fibers, tulle,

stencils, fabric paint, stamps, splattering, beading, etc. See Website: www.patchesandpaint.com/ workshops

## Workshop #2 Hazel Wainwright - Batik Curves - Batik curves/ Circle Dance

Hazel inherited her love of sewing from her granny and has been sharing this love with students for the past 15 years. She was introduced to quilting about 20 years ago and has explored many techniques and ways of using fabric which come under the heading of "Quilting". Hazel has participated in workshops given by national and international teachers, in addition to learning new skills on her own. She enjoys sharing her favourite hobby with students and seeing them enjoy the process and the results!

The drunkards path technique teaches curved piecing without the use of pins. The two different size blocks used in the "Circle Dance" pattern allow students to practice on both gentle and tighter curves to become very comfortable with sewing curves of any sort. # Sunshine Quilt Show Celebrating 25 Years Of Quilting Arts— 1st: 2015 Quilt Show BANNER Challenge

### **BANNER CHALLENGE**

## "Coastal Impressions"

In keeping with our quilt show theme – "Celebrating 25 years of Quilting Arts", this challenge should be your personal reflection of coastal Impressions and how it inspires your quilting. This banner does not need to be abstract; anything goes just use your imagination.

### **Banner Challenge Rules**

Top side Banner Width must be 25" (inches) in keeping with 25 years of quilting on the coast.

Length can be between 8-10' (feet)

Banner must have one or more PRI-MARY Colors incorporated.

50% or more must be three layers in keeping with the definition of a quilt. i.e. if you plan on using a sheer fabric then strips, appliqué or whatever other technique used needs to be three layers, three layers of anything used in the banner will be accepted. E.g. Three layers of sheer would be classified as quilted.

Banner must be Hangable from the 25" top.

#### Alternative to Banner:

We know that not everyone wants to create a banner, therefore, if you wish to create a table runner or bed protector or whatever. The choice is yours. The rules for the banner hold for these alternatives as well. Critical is that the width of 25" is mandatory and the lengths must still be between 8-10 feet.

You do not have to make the runner or protector double sided. However Backing used must be in keeping with the theme of your chosen work.

Get a partner or partners and create something wonderful to celebrate our 25th Anniversary, might be more fun that way.

## 2nd: 2015 Quilt Show Challenge: "Primary Colours and Beyond"

## "Primary Colours and Beyond"

Keeping with our theme — "Celebrating 25 years of Quilting Arts", this challenge should be your personal reflection of what your years of quilting means to you. We want you to think outside your box. Create something unique that reflects how special quilting is for you and what it means to you. Make something creative for our 25th anniversary of quilting on the Sunshine Coast.

## Challenge RULES:

Measurement of **two sides has to equal 25 inches**. i.e. if length is 12" then width would have to be 13" or if length was 6" then the width would have to be 19". You piece does not have to be symmetrical,

square or rectangular. As long as *half the measurement is 25*".

Must use <u>only one</u> of the primary colors. Primary colors are pure red, yellow and blue

#### Must use *two tertiary colors*.

Check your color wheels or books on color to determine tertiary colors. A primary mixed with a secondary creates a tertiary colour. Example of tertiary colours: turquoise, blueviolet, red-violet, red-orange, yellow-orange and lime green. Please do not use secondary colors which are: Orange, Purple and Green.

You can use tints and shades of the tertiary colors you have chosen.

If using a background it must be neutral in colour such as: black, white, ecru, grey. Quilts must have appropriate sleeves for hanging. If sleeves are not appropriate the quilt may not get hung.

That's it for the rules; the rest is up to you. *Remember this is supposed to be a challenge but it should always be fun as well.*Let your creative juices flow and think outside your box. Nothing says that you have to do abstract, anything goes as long as you meet the rules. Make your challenge memorable for our 25th Anniversary.

The Challenge committee reserves the right to disqualify any quilts that do not meet all the rules.


