1. Vacant Positions

There are vacancies in the Vice President and treasurer positions. There was extensive discussion regarding the issues that may be detriments for prospective candidates. One issue may be that the position of Vice President involves a 3 year commitment. Following discussion it was decided that a plea for volunteers would be sent out by email, and that there would be a discussion at the September meeting regarding changing the requirement to a 2 year time period. The position of Past President would be eliminated with the duties of the positions being shared by the Vice President and President.

2. Purchase of a Guild Computer

Lee Ewing advised that she had an opportunity to purchase a computer to facilitate keeping the Guild records for \$150.00. This computer will have the Guild software and information installed and be dedicated to the Guild finances passed from Treasurer to Treasurer.

It was MOVED and SECONDED that a Guild computer be purchased for an amount of \$150.00.

3. Charge for Emails

There was discussion regarding the amount to be charged for emails sent out by the Secretary. Presently the amount is \$35.00 which was felt to be excessive for Guild members.

It was MOVED and SECONDED that the charge for Guild Members for quilting related emails would be \$15.00 and that all commercial emails would remain at \$35.00. CARRIED

4. Treasurer's Report

It was reported that Ada Yeo has reviewed the Financial Statements and she reported that she would be getting some clarification from Priscilla Hendriks and Lee Ewing.

Sheila MacDonald advised that she had transferred a sum of dollars into the Guild Investment Chequing account, rather than leaving the total balance in the regular chequing account. It was also reported that the Guild had received a \$461.00 Grant from the SCRD.

5. Guild Storage

There was discussion regarding the length of time guild records must be kept. It was noted that there are boxes of paper that is probably not relevant and records that could be culled in order to reduce the space each Executive Member is having to keep on hand. It was noted that the Guild is not a Non Profit therefore there is no legal reason to keep redundant paper. It was decided that each Committee should review their documents and purge the records they have in order to reduce the storage space required. It was noted that the Comfort Society must keep all of the Committee records for legal reasons.

6. Signing Authorities at the Bank

It was decided to wait until there is a Treasurer to change the signing authorities.

7. Reports from Committees

The Committees are requested to get reports to the Secretary for incorporation into the minutes either by email or handed in at the meeting.

8. Satellite Groups It was noted that in order for the Satellite Groups to ensure that their members get all the Guild information it is important that a Rep be present at each Executive Meeting.

9. Membership

There was discussion regarding attracting and maintaining Members. It was noted that everyone must approach new members and make them welcome. It is hoped that with the new table arrangements that newcomers will be included in discussions and made to feel welcome. There was some discussion regarding asking some Members to act as greeters to have them show new members around.

10. Comfort Society

There was discussion regarding the direction the Comfort Society would take. The Guild is committed to providing Baby Quilts for the Hospital until the end of the year, then a new vote will be taken. Report on distribution of quilts attached.

11. Hanging of Quilts

Members are to be encouraged to bring Show and Tell, however it

was noted that some members have trouble hanging their quilts. A new step stool is to be purchased and some of the taller members will be asked to assist the more vertically challenged members. It was felt that Show and Tell is a great source of inspiration of all members.

12. Program

Ada Yeo reported that Correen Zerr, Martha Tatman and Kristen Hennibury would be teachers throughout the year. The Program Committee is busy organizing the Fun Days and further information will be in the Newsletter each month.

13. Bus Trips

Gail Reichert reported that Bus Trips will be shorter and less expensive than in the past. She also stated that she will facilitate rides to local area Quilt Shows.

14. Adjournment

The meeting adjourned at 1:30 pm.







Challenge Quilt: Wall hanging. Minimum size 18" x 18", Maximum size 40" x 40", viewers should clearly see what season this is by colours or content of the scene. Please have a hanging sleeve system in place, sleeve, stick, tabs, etc. and your name, phone number, and guild pinned to the back.

Quilt Styles and Types (Please read before next resource day)

The program committee is adding a new dimension to our show and tell section of resource day. We are going to try and interactive show and tell at the next resource day so we would like to encourage you to read this article prior to the meeting.

Pat Sloan has stated on the Fat Quarter Shop website that... "Most people when they learn to quilt start out with patchwork, or pieced quilts. We learn block construction and the techniques to create quilts that are fit together with squares, rectangles and a few other more advanced shapes... like a Double Wedding Ring. ...

After a while many of us venture into other styles of quilts. Maybe because we prefer rounded shapes like flowers and hearts (that's me!). Or some want ultimate precision like a paper-pieced pattern can provide. Or a portable project like English Paper piecing. Most recently the Modern Quilt style has emerged with a look that is simple, clean and uses more solids and space in the finished pieced. Then there are the Art quilters, who wildly go where no quilter has gone before and create amazing works of art! "

Here is an explanation different types and styles of quilting:

Pieced or Patchwork Quilts- any quilt that is made up of different fabrics sewn together. There are many types of pieced quilts that can be found: theme/ scrappy; planned/ unplanned; vintage inspired/ modern; they can be made from a pattern or free form (using innovative piecing); etc.

- 1. Appliqued Quilts- these quilts involve placing shapes onto a background then sewing them to the background using various hand or machine techniques.
- 2. Art Quilts-are simply art. The Studio Art Quilt Associates (SAQA) defines the art quilt as "a creative visual work that is layered and stitched or that references this form of stitched layered structure."
- 3. Modern Quilts-is a genre of pieced quilts that grown mostly through the internet. However, the creation of the Modern Quilt Guild in 2009 moved it into the realms of in-person meetings. A few traits of Modern Quilts are: bold colors, graphic design, and the use of negative space.
- 4. Paper Piecing or Foundation Piecing-is a quilt that is achieved by stitching fabric onto a paper foundation. Once the sections are finished the paper is removed. With paper piecing, quilters can achieve perfect points much easier.
- 5. English Paper Piecing- is a type of quilting that is used to piece shapes with many sides and in-set seams. It involves cutting individual paper templates (or purchasing readymade templates), folding and basting fabric around those individual shapes, then whip stitching these together to form larger shapes or blocks. The templates are removed once the quilt is complete. It is a very portable type of quilting.

CUTTING MAT TIP:

Every quilter needs a gum eraser rotary cutting mats don't heal because threads get into the cuts; it is said to run a gum eraser over the mat; it pulls out the threads and allows the mat to heal.

HISTORY

In 1982 a group of women on the Sunshine Coast got together to share their love of quilting. Pat Crucil, an accomplished quilter and teacher, established this first quilt group on the Coast. **Today** the Sunshine Coast Quilters' Guild is the "umbrella" organization for seven local community quilt groups from Pender Harbour to Gibsons, with a membership of 175. The guild promotes the joy of quilting on the Coast by providing enjoyment through quilt shows, classes, demonstrations and displays. We continue to meet eight days throughout our Guild year, from September to May at the Holy Family Parish Hall in West Sechelt (5700 Nickerson Road). Our meetings consist of Mini-Workshops, Business Meetings, Show and Tell, and a Program.

COLOR CATCHER TIP:

The color catcher is a piece of white something with soda ash solution dried onto it. You can make your own with soda ash, usually sold in swimming pool supply areas of hardware stores. (Grandma called it washing soda.) Just put a tablespoon of the dry soda into a cup of hot water until it dissolves. Put in a yard of white junk fabric, or ratty toweling, and let it become saturated. Let it dry. Cut off a piece and wash it with your bleedable fabric. The soda ash grabs and holds the dye. You can make a lifetime supply of color catchers with a buck or two of soda ash. For those of you who tie dye, this is exactly the technique for pre-treating fabric before applying dye. Soda plus cotton, grabs loose dye molecules. Author unknown
