

Dear Member Guild;

How would you like to get your guild members working on an exciting national quilting project that will help sick kids right across Canada? You can! And here's how:

To celebrate Canada's 150th birthday the Canadian Quilters' Association is hosting Canada's Big Quilt Bee. Our goal is to make and donate 1,000 quilts for kids at Ronald MacDonald Houses across Canada. But we can't do it without you!

There are 14 Ronald MacDonald Houses across Canada, all associated with local children's hospitals, with a total of 469 family rooms. These rooms are full all year and there are actually waiting lists for residency while children are treated in hospital.

Canada's Big Quilt Bee will be held June 14-17, 2017 at Quilt Canada 2017 in Toronto, ON. There will be sewing machines, long arms, mid arms and an army of volunteers ready to work on quilt tops and stacks of slabs made by hundreds of Canadian quilters.

Here's where your Guild's help is needed: Before May 10, 2017 we need thousands of 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " slab blocks, each with at least one piece of specialty fabric celebrating Canada's 150th in them. It doesn't matter which fabric company you use, as long as one piece of fabric in each block is a Canada 150 fabric. We have emailed 350 fabric stores across Canada telling them about this project and encouraging them to stock some Canada 150 Birthday fabric.

Here is how your Guild can participate:

- □ Hold *Big Quilt Bee workshops* for your members to:
- 1) make the slab blocks (each with at least one piece of any Canada 150th birthday fabric),
- 2) make quilt tops using the slab blocks,
- 3) make finished guilts from the guilt tops.

If you would like to partner with us on this worthwhile and fun project see below for all of the ways you can get involved. We want to hear from you and want to put your guild on our social media sites so quilters in the whole country can see what you are doing to help.

We look forward to working with you to help kids and families across Canada and to celebrate Canada's 150th Birthday.

How do you make a slab?

If you have the book, Sunday Morning Quilts see the directions on pages 48-49.

But if you don't have the book, the directions below show hot to make a slab:

To commemorate Canada's birthday, each slab must have at least one piece of the Canada 150th fabric that is available through Northcott, Trend Tex Inc., Cantik Batiks and perhaps other fabric companies. You may mix in your own fabric but there has to be at least one piece of special Canada 150th fabric.

How to Make a Slab

- ☐ Start with small bits or big ones, it doesn't matter.
- ☐ Make sure there is at least one piece of Canada's 150th birthday fabric.
- □ Raid your scrap bins and go with what you've got. You might want to use like-colours in a slab.
- ☐ Take two pieces of fabric and sew them together.
- ☐ Do that a few more times. Then sew more pieces to those first pairs.
- ☐ Sew groups together.
- □ Add additional pieces of fabric to get to the finished size of 12 1/2 inches square.

Have fun and make several slabs in different colours.

How to make quilt Tops:


Would you like to use your slabs to make a whole quilt top?


We need two sizes: larger for big kids and smaller for little kids.

Larger Quilt: Sew 4 blocks together for each row. Make 6 rows and sew them together to make a quilt top that will be 48 1/2 in x 72 1/2 in.

Smaller Quilt: Sew 3 blocks together for each row. Make 4 rows and sew them together to make a quilt top that will be $36\ 1/2$ in. $x\ 48\ 1/2$ in.

Batting Basics Everything you need to

Common Batting Fiber Content

NATURAL FIBERS Bamboo, Cotton Silk, Soy + Wool

SYNTHETIC FIBERS Recycled Plastic Bottles

BLENDS

HIGH LOFT - Thick,
can be airy or dense.
Generally polyester. Great for
highlighting detailed quilting.
Best hand-tied.
LOW LOFT - Thin, can be airy or
dense. Generally cotton. Easy
to sew by hand or machine.
Drapes well.

How Batting is Formed

BONDED – Fibers held together w/ Starch or Resin, similar to glue. Needles glide easily, great for hand quilting. Least likely to beard. NEEDLE PUNCHED – Compressed together by tiny needles. Very stable. Dense. Low-loft

Generally not recommended for hand-quilters. Best for non-wash less-wash items like wall hangings

Possible Shrinkage

POLYESTER: None POLY BLENDED W/ NATURAL Very Little SILK: 5 NATURAL FIBERS: 2 – 3% (COTTONS, BAMBOO)

WARMTH

HIGH: Wool MEDIUM: Polyester, Silk, Bamboo LOW: Cotton, Poly/Cotton, Soy

Standard Packaged

Batting Sizes

CRAFT: 36" x 45"

CRIB: 45" x 60" TWIN: 72" x 90" FULL: 81" x 96" QUEEN: 90" x 108" KING: 120" x 120"

When in doubt... Quilt 2" - 4" inches apart Do not prewash.

Washibility

POLYESTER: Washable + dryable. Low heat.

WOOL: Only after being quilted. COTTONS, BAMBOOS, SILK: Washable & Dryable. May shrink slightly after initial wash WATER-SOLUBLE BONDING

FLAME RETARDANT – Will not melt low when in contact with flame, ideal for baby & children's items.

know about batting

FUSIBLE – Outer layers have a heat-sensitive web that gently adheres to fabric. Layer your backing, battling & quilt top, iron from the center out, 3–5 seconds per area. Usually cotton setting with steam is recommended.

General Recommended Intervals

Recommendations vary widely according to each manufacture.

BAMBOO: Up to 8"

COTTON: Bonded 8" - 10"/Needled 3" - 4"

POLYESTER: 2" - 4" or 3" - 12"

SILK: 3"

SOY: Up to 8"

WOOL: 2" - 3" or 4"+

Suggested Applications

ART/WALL HANGINGS: Needled. CHILDREN'S USE: Flame-retardant. ELIMINATE BASTING: Fusible. HAND QUILTED: Bonded. Low-loft. HAND TIED: Bonded. High loft. LOTS OF WASHES: Polyester/Poly Blends Scrim. WEARABLE: Natural fibers. Low-loft. MACHINE QUILTING:

Needled with scrim. Bonded. Fusible. Low loft.

HEAT INSULATING: Wool. (POTHOLDERS/HOT PADS)

How can I fluff and remove wrinkles from batting?

Use a steamer, or unfold and let sit out over night, fluff in dryer with damp towel for 10 minutes on low setting.

Do I need to prewash/presoak?

Not necessarily. Most manufacture's Most manufacture's recommended using batting right out of the package.

BONDED: No, as water-soluble bonding agents loosen with water.

FUSIBLE: No, fusing agents might be washed away. Natural material can shrink up to 3%. This can "crinkle" the look of you quilt. If you choose, prewash/soak by hand, with warm water in sink. Do not agitate in washing machine. Let soak, and dry in dryer on Let soak, and dry in dryer on low heat or hang dry.

...LOFT?

The thickness of batting. High loft is very thick and fluffy, with many layers. Low loft is thin, lighter weight, less layers.

...SCRIM?

What is...

...BEARDING?

Fibers from batting migrating and coming through the surface of the quilt.

MOST LIKELY: Polyester & Wool SOME LIKELIHOOD: Cotton Polyester LESS LIKELY: 100% Bonded LESS LIKELY: 100% Cotton Needled (After Initial Washing)
