# S.C.Q.G. Resource Day Minutes September 29, 2012 Holy Family Church Hall, Sechelt, BC

President Lois Anderson called the meeting to order at 10:35 a.m. and presented Fay Bullock with her Past President's pin. Lois thanked Sew Easy and Fibre Expressions for presenting mini workshops at our first meeting of the season. Forms were handed out for participation in an ice breaker game, and about 40 minutes was devoted to this fun activity.

#### **President's Report**: Lois Anderson

- Lois welcomed everyone to the meeting and asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the May meeting: moved by Eve Quigley, seconded by Judi Wilson, carried.
- Lois asked that Secretary, Merilee Martell, read two letters received from Capilano University bursary recipients.
- As we have no Vice-President this year, Lois indicated there would be no Guild after May 2013 and made a plea for someone to take on this position.

#### **Treasurer's Report:** Priscilla Hendriks

Priscilla stated that she has not yet been able to prepare a budget but this should be ready for the October meeting.

#### **New Business:**

Additional quilt frames are needed for the Quilt Show: Moved by Sheila MacDonald, seconded by Carol Adams that we spend \$3,000.00 for these, carried.

Mini workshops will be provided by the satellite groups (two each). This will be coordinated by Cathy Collins.

The President's Challenge quilt needs 25 finished blocks and members can sign up for these today. The finished quilt will be queen sized and prepared with Japanese fabrics. It will be presented to the Hospital Auxiliary for a raffle.

CQA's national challenge to measure all Show & Tell quilts and submit the total, in inches, will be coordinated by Lynda White.

#### SCQG 2013 QUILT SHOW CHALLENGE

You are invited to enter a finished quilt to meet the following challenge:

To create a quilt that depicts one or all of the scenes that make the Sunshine Coast special to you. This is wide open to your individual creativity and imagination whether you are a "new" or "seasoned" quilter, **BUT** you must meet the following criteria:

Finished size: 10" X 24" (Can be horizontal or vertical) with a sleeve on the back for hanging

The quilt must include a sun somewhere on it, any size.

It must include a traditional block of your choice, any size.

That's it!!

There will be two categories: One for those who use a Computerized Embroidery Machine to create their vision and One for Hand Embroidered or Machine Stitched Embellishments.

You may use ONE fabric photo in your design no larger than 5" X 7", but this may not include the sun nor the traditional block.

The winners in both categories will be voted on by attendees at the 2013 SCQG Quilt Show.

Mercedes Link will demonstrate different ways to make Flying Geese. Mercedes is bringing her sewing machine so she can show us how to sew Flying Geese. She will have handouts and some fabric so that we can make a small sample by hand. For this you will need to bring a small, hand-sewing kit.

#### **Reverse Applique**

Elizabeth Nordlund is going to teach us reverse applique. This technique is seen in Hawaiian and Mola quilts. You will need to bring a fine needle, scissors, a thimble if you use one, and a pen and paper for taking notes. Elizabeth will provide a kit, with all of the necessary fabric, for \$5.00.

Hilary will be teaching classes she has designed for us:

- 1. Quilting with Mettle/Metal. This class will teach you the how-to's when working with metal as an applique accent.
- 2. Squiggles & Doodles Thread Embellishment. In this class Hilary will lead you into creating thread embellishments to be used as a focal point.

Sharon will be teaching 2 of her favorite and most popular classes:

- **1. Two at a time A Reversible Quilt.** In this class you will be piecing a block and quilting it at the same time!
- **2. Rose of Sharon.** This is an machine applique class using the edge turned applique technique. These classes will be open to the general public.
