



Attention was brought to the SCQG membership about four of the various challenges presented for CQA Conference, Edmonton, 2020.

* The TrendTex Challenge fabric kits are now available and members who are interested in taking part are advised to purchase their kit before they are sold out. April 6 deadline for entries to be eligible for judged prizes. May 27 deadline for entry in the silent auction fundraiser, no judging.

Correction on info given at Resource Day: 1 kit per member available beginning October 2019, 1 per non-member beginning November 2019. After January 1, 2020, additional kits may be purchased if available.

Look for last year's entries to this Challenge on the CQA website.

- * The Member Guild Challenge: Gateway to Adventure, the challenge which allows for only one selected quilt to be entered from each Guild across Canada, this year involves use of designated KONA cotton colour #k001-147 JUNGLE (yes, it's green) along with 3 additional fabrics. A viewers' choice will be held at a Resource Day in the event of multiple entries from our Guild. Please let me know by March 1, 2020 if you plan to enter this challenge.
- * The Try-A-Triad Challenge is your opportunity to use the colours red, blue, and yellow and to get in touch with your "inner modern". Using solid colours only, play with design elements such as: negative space, graphics, improvisational piecing, grid work, asymmetry and modern traditionalism. Quilts must be received by CQA by May 30 to be displayed at Quilt Canada 2020.
- * The Quilted Postcard Challenge has resulted in wonderful success as a fundraiser for the recent CQA Conferences. The CQA 2020 theme for this challenge is "Inspired by Nature". Entries received prior to May 1, 2020 will be eligible for judging. Multiple entries permitted. Cindy's Threadworks has provided a valuable source of demos and lessons on You Tube related to this specific challenge. Check them out.

SCQG President Challenge 2019-20

"Music is my Muse"

Music has the ability to move people in many ways and sometimes at the oddest times. It can get us up out of our chairs, bring back memories and change the way we feel at any given moment.

This is the challenge:

There are three categories.

"Memories"

What song brings back that moment in time. The good, the bad and the weird. Where were you when you first heard the music and why do you remember it so well. Does it bring back your first kiss? Your first slow dance? A moment frozen in time that floods back every time you hear it.

"Get up out of that chair!"

What song always gets you up on the dance floor? What guilty pleasure gets you up out of your sewing room chair and dancing with and by yourself with nobody watching. What music makes your body want to move!?

"A little bit of soul."

What song reaches into your soul and pulls out your guts? What song do you listen to over and over again that speaks to you? What song has the ability to take you from a mood of 1 and take you to a 10? Or reversed? 10 to a 1 and crying on the floor. That song that tells your story.

Rules

- 1. You may enter all three categories as many times as you like. Let's face it! We sometimes have more than one song that can make us laugh or cry.
- 2. Or, you may enter only one category once.
- 3. All technology of quilting may be used but, it must be your own design. Traditional, modern, art, etc.
- 4. It must be a quilt by definition. Three layers held together with stitches.
- 5. I would like to limit the size to 40" by 40". But any size up to that will qualify.
- 6. You must include the name of the song and a description, short or long, of why you choose the song. These will hang with your quilt at the reveal.

The reveal will be at the May 2020 Resource meeting.

A viewers' choice ribbon will be presented in each category.

Hands Across the Water

Memories by Sheila Scrase Submitted by Verna Power

The COMOX VALLEY SCHOOLHOUSE QUILTERS GUILD hosted a very successful Hands Across the Water – Gathering of the Guilds, in October.

Sheila Scrase recalls the very first Hands Across the Water held in 1989:

I was recently taking a trip down memory lane and I was inspired, once again, by my affiliation with such a wonderful pursuit as quilting. Our guild, in its infancy, realized there were many fellow quilters out there seeking information and inspiration regarding quilts. Our own guild members met at the Lake Trail Jr. Secondary school and were producing wonderful quilts. We began to wonder what other groups were doing; so one day I suggested we invite Powell River over for lunch and a Show and Tell. They were delighted and accepted the invitation. We provided the main

The Ladies of the Comox Valler Schoolhouse Quilt Guild have been spreading a little Christmas Cheer by delivering quilts to four places.

Allow me to introduce the Ailsa Craig Quilt & Fibre Arts Festival. The festival is an international event that sees this tiny village in southwestern Ontario, Canada bring fibre artists from visiting countries to display over 120 quilt and fibre art works of exceptional international quality. The visiting fibre artists teach workshops throughout the week, walk the show to converse with guests, are billeted by local townspeople and generally get a wonderful taste of life in North Middlesex while sharing their rich culture with our guests.

Our guest country for 2020 will be Spain.

We would like to extend an invitation to the second Quilt and Fibre Art Challenge to be hosted by the Ailsa Craig Quilt & Fibre Arts Festival. We invite Fibre Artists from across Canada to participate in this challenge to celebrate the culture, flora, fauna, history and geography that comprises Spain.

The Challenge "Spain Through Our Eyes" was developed to allow the Festival's many followers to participate fully in the event, even if distance precluded their attendance. All art work will be on display in the Ailsa Craig Arts Centre and Ye Olde Town Hall during the 2020 Festival and viewed by approximately 3,000 visitors. An additional Canadian Travelling Trunk Show may also be established.
