Since July, we have delivered 124 comfort quilts into the community. During this time, we received 123 quilts; 12 of which came on Resource Day.


Keep up the good work! The groups receiving your quilts are just thrilled and excited to get them.

Mask maker, mask maker, make me a mask......

Just an update on how the mask making project is proceeding.

Many ladies are able to make it to either Marian Williamson's place in Gibsons to drop off their masks; others are dropping off at Fibre Expressions and we have a HUGE number dropped off at the September Resource Day!

So 1st pick up was 119 masks and the 2nd pick up was 221 masks = grand total so far: 340.

So we are well on our way and for sure we have some SUPER SEWERS in our group. But please just make what you can and enjoy the process. I know we will all be sick and tired of making masks vs. playing with quilts and of course we need to set time aside for BOM, Mini Projects, Challenges etc. etc. so pace yourselves and know that they are really going to our community for those in greatest need.

I met with Jane MacDonald of the Hospital Foundation and Christine Fearn last week – through Zoom (man, that's quite the time saver, no travel time, just sign on and talk or listen). We wanted to ensure that there are no duplications and that we are not getting burned out yet able to continue getting masks out to the community.

As you know = we (Guild and Aux Sewers) are making the masks. I collect them, if they are not within their own baggies (already sanitized) I sanitize them (hot dryer 20 min) and place them into baggies. Then they go to Christine Fearn who puts labels on them and distributes them.

Christine also checks with me to see if the Sewers need further elastic, nose pieces, fabric. She now has a supply of 'dongles' (these are those round things that the elastic can be fed through and people can adjust their ear elastic that way vs. us sewing the to 'x' inch or knotting them to 'x' inch. So if you need any supplies please just let me know and you will be able to pickup what you need from me or Marian.

The Hospital Foundation – Jane MacDonald has given us assurances of covering all future costs for mask making! It is coming from the COVID fund that was setup earlier. So we have Community Funds helping the Community at large.

We are just getting rolling now, so I will keep you all posted as we move along and let you know of our progress. If you would like more information or supplies please contact myself at: 604-313-1820 or karen@klbhr.ca



REQUIREMENTS AND CUTTING

Fabrics

Yellow: one fat eighth - Cut 12 (2") squares

- Cut 12 (2" x 3 1/2") rectangles

Green: one fat eighth

- Cut 16 (2") squares

- Cut 8 (2" x 3 1/2") rectangles

Brown:

- Cut 1 (6 1/2") square

Tools Needed: sewing machine, rotary cutter, cutting mat, scissors, ruler, iron

PATTERN NOTES


- Finished block size is 12" x 12". (Unfinished block size is 12 1/2" x 12 1/2".)
- Sew with a 1/4" seam allowance.
- RST means place fabric with Right Sides Together.


ASSEMBLY

1. Flower Center Unit

Mark diagonal line on yellow square and place on corner of brown square RST. Sew along the line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4" outside the seam line. Flip and press seam allowance toward the yellow corner. Repeat for each corner. Fun fact, this is called a snowball block.










2. Petal Units

Mark diagonal line on green square and place on yellow rectangle RST as shown. Sew along the line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4" outside the seam line. Flip and press seam allowance toward the green corner. Repeat with each of the twelve yellow rectangles. Sew a green square to a yellow square and press toward the yellow square. Make four. Assemble four petal units as shown below and press seam allowances to the right.









3. Corner Units

Mark diagonal line on yellow square and place on green rectangle RST as shown. Sew along the line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4" outside the seam line. Flip and press seam allowance toward the yellow corner. Repeat with each of four green rectangles. Assemble four corner units as shown below and press seam allowances to the right.








4. Assemble Block

Lay out units as shown below. Sew units into three rows, then sew the rows together. Follow arrows in the diagram for pressing directions. Trim block to $12 \, 1/2$ " square.



TIPS FOR FLIPPED CORNERS

- Sew slightly outside the marked diagonal to allow for the fold. This will help your flipped corners line up correctly.
- Test the flipped corners before you trim!


Background is scraps of whites, off whites, cream and light beige. Mix up the background.

Bluebird is scraps of light, medium and dark blue scraps.

Bird beak is yellow.

Package block in a zip-lock baggie with your name on it and bring to September Resource Day. You may enter more than once. Indicate on the baggie how many blocks are in your zip-lock. Winner takes all!

- b 2½in x 7½in (6.4cm x 19cm)
- c 11/sin (3.8cm) square
- d 41/sin x 31/sin (11.4cm x 9cm)
- e 4½in x 5½in (11.4cm x 14cm)
- f 3in (7.6cm) square
- g 2%in (6cm) square to make 2in half-square triangles (unfinished)
- h 2in (5.1cm) square
- i 3½in (9cm) square
- j 1¾in (4.4cm) square
- k 3½in x 4in (9cm x 10.2cm)
- I 4in x 3%in (10.2cm x 9.5cm)
- m 4%in (11.1cm) square to make 4in half-square triangles (unfinished)




2 The block uses units that have a triangle created on a corner, so we will show this technique first. Take a b rectangle and one c square. Pencil mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the small square and place the square right sides together with the top right corner of the rectangle, with the marked line angled as shown in Fig C. Pin if needed and then sew along the marked line and trim off excess fabric ¼in (6mm) outside the sewn lines. Press the triangle outwards.

Fig C Making corner triangles




3 Four other units in the block need corner triangles using the same technique – see Fig D for the fabric and triangle positions.

4 The other units to make are half-square triangles (HST). Make one HST as follows. Take one print g square and one solid g square and cut each square in half along one diagonal to make two triangles from each square (Fig E 1). Pair up two different triangles, place them right sides together and sew a ¼in (6mm) seam along the long diagonal side. Press the seam open or to one side. Check the half-square triangle unit is 2in (5.1cm) square. Repeat this to make a second HST unit, this time using the fabrics shown in Fig E 2. Use this same HST technique and the m squares to make another HST unit (Fig E 3). This time, the unit should be 4in (10.2cm) square once sewn.

5 To assemble the block, take all of the units you have made, plus pieces a, l and n and arrange them into columns, as shown in Fig F. Sew the units together as shown, and press. Now sew the four columns together, as in Fig G and press.

Fig F Assembling the units into columns






Fig G Sewing the columns together



6 To add the border, take the two o pieces and sew them to the top and bottom of the block (Fig H) and press. Check the block is $13 \text{in} \times 12 \text{in} (33 \text{cm} \times 30.5 \text{cm})$.
