## **NEW CHALLENGE AND MINI PROJECT FOR MAY**

**NEW: APRIL CHALLENGE:** Have a PANEL? The challenge is to make a quilt – your choice for size, theme etc. – using a PANEL. Send a picture with a write up to Karen B. so that it can be included in the May Show N' Tell.



**NEW: APRIL MINI PROJECT**: Quilting Journal/Book Cover. Show us how creative you are! Send a picture with a write up to Karen B. so that it can be included in the May Show N' Tell. Instructions below to help you with making one.

## **Quilting Journal / Book Cover**

- Measure size of Journal:
  - width all around and add 3/4 "
  - length (height) and add 3/4" -
  - cut 2
- Flaps (distance from edge to spiral) subtract 1", and add ¾"
  - width x 2
  - same height as journal
  - cut 2 and fold in 1/2 wrong sides together
- Middle outside edge binding: Cut 2 2" wide and press each with wrong sides together.
- Quilt top with lining and batting. Densely Quilt top piece to make sturdier (or just quilt outside piece only. Can put on applique.



- Cut 2 ribbons for ties and pin to middle of each outside edge, lining side up.
- For flaps press wrong sides together. Align with sides of cover and pin on top of ribbons all the way around (ensure ribbons are not caught up in stitching).
- Pin binding to raw edge middle section to centre between flaps.
- Sew ¼" around all cover. Clip corners and turn inside out.



# Sunshine Coast Quilters' Guild – 40 Quilts Donated



CQA.ACC Guild Reports

In \*"The Beachcombers" town of Gibsons on the Sunshine Coast of B.C., a new affordable housing project has just been completed to help people at risk of, or experiencing, homelessness. The Comfort Society (which is a committee within the Sunshine Coast Quilters' Guild that looks after donating quilts) reached out to RainCity Housing, who is operating this new facility, to ask if they would like any quilts. The offer was met with enthusiasm and the Guild membership was informed of their need. Our members rose to the occasion and supplied all 40 twin quilts that were required to give every resident a quilt for their bed. All done within 6 weeks.

The Sunshine Coast Quilters' Guild started up almost 40 years ago and now has over 100 members. There are six local community quilt groups that are under the "umbrella" of the Sunshine Coast Quilters' Guild. We have been using Zoom to conduct our monthly meetings during these Covid times. The silver lining of this type of meeting is that we have had some wonderful speakers that we couldn't have afforded to bring to our part of the world.









## **KEEPING YOUR CUTTING MAT IN TIP TOP SHAPE:**

Self-healing cutting mats are one of a quilter's most important tools. With a little care you can get a lot of years out of your mat. Here are few reminders to help keep your mat healthy for years to come:

- 1. Clean off fibres and thread every once in awhile. They keep your mat from healing. Use an eraser or soft brush that will not scratch the mat.
- 2. Once clean, you are ready to moisturize it. Soak it in a vinegar/water solution (1/4 cup per 4 litres of cool water) in the bathtub. Let soak for 15 minutes. Ideally the mat should lie flat while soaking but if that's not possible, let it bend up the side and reposition it from time to time so the entire mat gets a good soak. You may add a bit of mild dish soap and use a soft brush to gently scrub the surface to get any last bits of fibres trapped in the cuts.
- 3. Rinse with cool water to remove any residue. Dry with a soft towel and let it air dry on a flat surface.





## TIPS FOR PROLONGING THE LIFE OF YOUR SELF-HEALING CUTTING MAT

- keep your mat clean, moist, flat, away from heat including direct sun.
- vary where you cut on the mat to prevent deep groves from developing.
- store it flat, not rolled up or standing on edge (this may cause cracking).
- Don't iron on your mat, don't set hot beverages on it, don't leave it in a hot car, or near any hot surface or in direct sunlight (any heat may cause your mat to warp).
- Keep away from extreme cold. Your mat may shatter in extreme cold.
- Clean and moisturize your mat regularly using the soaking method described above.

By keeping the mat moisturized and clean, rotary blades will last longer.

CQA are busy bees getting ready for their first virtual Quilt Canada conference,





## **HISTORY**

**In 1982** a group of women on the Sunshine Coast got together to share their love of quilting. Pat Crucil, an accomplished quilter and teacher, established this first quilt group on the Coast.

Today the Sunshine Coast Quilters' Guild is the "umbrella" organization for six local community quilt groups from Pender Harbour to Gibsons, with a membership of 110. The guild promotes the joy of quilting on the Coast by providing enjoyment through quilt shows, classes, demonstrations and displays. We continue to meet eight\* days throughout our Guild year, from September to May at the Holy Family Parish Hall in West Sechelt (5700 Nickerson Road). Our meetings consist of Mini-Workshops, Business Meetings, Block of the Month, Show and Tell, Library and a Program.
