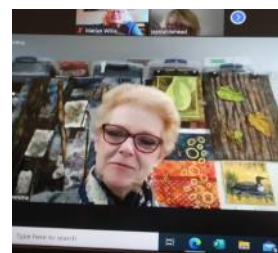

## THIS & THAT.....

### CALLING FOR MASK MAKERS :

What happens when a child arrives at school without their mask or they have a mask malfunction during the day?



The School District has asked for masks for grades 4 to 12.

All masks should be adult sized. The style is the 7" pleated with elastic and cord locks, 3 ply with the inner layer of polypropylene and a nose wire across the top. Masks can be machine stitched or serged.

Plain fabrics are the best. As these masks cannot go in the dryer, they need to be packaged individually in ziplock bags and left for 3 days before they are taken to the school for distribution. We can supply the polypropylene and nose wires and we have cord locks and some elastic.

### WAY TO GO ANNE SELDER : We are proud of you!

***Congratulations to SCQG member, Anne Selder. Her piece called "Kona Girl" has been accepted into the National Juried Show (NJS) under "Art Depiction of Human or Animal Form" at Quilt Canada (June 16 – 19, 2021). I look forward to seeing it at the Virtual NJS Show on June 16<sup>th</sup>. Here is some info from Anne about the process:***

"I had completed the piece last June for my stepdaughter's birthday. I was so happy with the results, I knew I wanted to enter into a show. When I found out Quilt Canada in 2021 was to be virtual, I decided it was the show I would enter. Since I did not have the piece, my grandson had to take the appropriate pictures of the quilt in the proper sizes. It took a few tries and finally I had to get the quilt and take some of the photos myself as my grandson's camera could not get the photo size large enough.

Once I had the photos in January, I joined the **Canadian Quilters Association** and applied to enter my quilt. Since my quilt is stretched on a frame, I was requested to send a photo of part of the process of putting it together. I was able to do so because I had kept a photo journal of the steps. Once all the photos were sent in, I had to wait until April to hear if I was accepted. My acceptance email stated if I said anything on social media, **I would not share any photographs**, but make a written announcement only. Sharing photographs on social media could make it difficult for judges to be impartial during the final judging process and the awarding of ribbons and prizes.

So now I wait until the show on June 16 to see the results. It has been a good experience and I am thrilled I was even accepted.

After June 16, I can give you some photos."

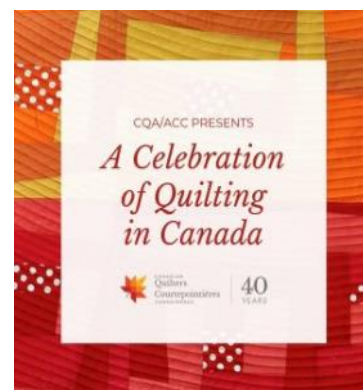

**In 1982** a group of women on the Sunshine Coast got together to share their love of quilting. Pat Crucil, an accomplished quilter and teacher, established this first quilt group on the Coast.

**Today** the Sunshine Coast Quilters' Guild is the "umbrella" organization for six local community quilt groups\*\* from Pender Harbour to Gibsons, with a membership of 110. The guild promotes the joy of quilting on the Coast by providing enjoyment through quilt shows, classes, demonstrations and displays. We continue to meet eight\* days throughout our Guild year, from September to May at the Holy Family Parish Hall in West Sechelt (5700 Nickerson Road). Our meetings consist of Mini-Workshops, Business Meetings, Block of the Month, Show and Tell, Library and a Program.
