Judi Wilson - I made for my friend Joan, who hasn't been feeling to well. I had left over squares from a CQA project.





- 38x44" for the CS






### • Joan Baker - Quilt 2:

Another panel quilt but this time I cut it up into squares and strips and added the blue/green cloud fabric.


30x45" for CS.














- Moira Sarling Here is the top of my panel quilt.








