Intake - 296 quilts; Distribution - 308 quilts




Free Motion Ruler Work and Quilt As You Go



Catherine Nicholls is presenting a 2-day class

Haiku Tulips

Day 1 will be exploring colour and colour blending using thickened dyes. Creating possible backgrounds and follow along with lots of mark making in each student's individual colour palette. While the fabrics are resting students will create their own series of tulips inspired designs using a simple drawing activity.

Day 2 will see students combining colours and designs to create a textile tribute to spring! Or maybe summer?

There will be a supply list.

Note that an email went out late August to those who had signed up for this cancelled class from spring 2021 so they have 1st refusal for this class. Once Program knows if there are any spaces available, we will present this information to the Guild members and open registration. We have a maximum 10 attendees for this class.





Sunshine Coast Quilters Guild Monthly Skill Builder Challenge 8 monthly skills – in 12 ½ inch blocks

The program committee is presenting a series of eight monthly skill building lessons. Each lesson is designed to teach a new skill or to refresh a skill already in your repertoire. Some **techniques** have many ways to accomplish the same end point – time to try a new way perhaps! You will be challenged to complete a 12 ½ inch unfinished block each month.

At the conclusion of the year you will have 8 blocks completed. These can be put together into a sampler quilt, a wall hanging, made into a series of placemats, or your choice. You could also choose to make more blocks for a larger project. Additional skill ideas will be provided after month 8. The blocks could also become good samples to practice different quilting ideas on. The choice is entirely up to you.

Your name will be entered for a draw prize for each skill completed – eight potential chances to win.

If you want to make a coordinated project - a suggestion of 8 different fabrics, each at least one FQ sized.

Additional 1 meter dedicated to sashing, borders and bindings should suffice. This project can also be scrap based – raid those bins you have been collecting!

There are only three rules: 1) try the monthly skill 2) complete a 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch unfinished block 3) have fun!

Bring completed blocks to the program table at any Resource Day to enter the draw. First chance will be September 25!

Month 1: Precision - your 1/4 inch seam as a foundation skill

An often debated topic in quilt making. Does precision really matter? Well it depends.



For a quilt composed of many pieces and blocks – it is important for it to fit together. Imagine a quilt row made up of 9 - 4 inch squares. If your seaming accuracy is off by 1/16th of an inch sometimes and accurate other times, one row of 9 blocks could grow by ½ inch compared to another. Multiply this into an elaborate block and you get the picture.

For this month you are challenged to make a 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch unfinished block with multiple seams in each row. The design can be as straight forward as 36 - 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares pieced together, 6 rows with 6 squares in each. You can also choose your own block – for this exercise best to stay with squares and rectangles only. The block will measure 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch square, and when sewn into a quilt will measure 12 inches. Magic.

As you go - carefully check your accuracy, adjust your needle position or mark your seam allowance line on your throat plate. Choose a method that works for you AND your tools – not necessary to add more tools. Remember that each combination of fabric and thread may yield different results – key is to check your accuracy for each project. The goal is to achieve an accurate measurement on the front side of the block between the two seams, with 1/4 inch remaining on each block edge for seaming.

There are MANY resources available online to help you with this task – if you use any search engine and enter "quilt $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seaming", look in the video tab and you will have several methods to try.

Here is one I particularly liked: "Quilting 101: Perfecting your ¼ inch seam" by Cindy Bee.


