# **GETTING TO KNOW YOU**



Each month your newsletter editor features one member. Do you have suggestions for people to be featured?

Nancy McMurdo: You will find Nancy working diligently at the Program Table, organizing the boutique and vendors for the upcoming quilt show and generally jumping in to do whatever needs to be done. Nancy was the brains behind the "Perception Rules" challenge.

#### How long have you lived on the Sunshine Coast? If not for ever, what brought you here?

We moved from Cochrane AB. My husband was retiring and we were looking to move to a place where the weather was a little easier in the winter. I come from maritime parents and love the ocean so the BC coast seemed an appropriate place to look. #### When and why did you start quilting?

I started quilting in my late teens. I would acquire quilt tops that my mother had been given or picked up at different sales and we would set them up on a large frame and hand quilt them.

#### Mentors?

I would say I have had 3 major mentors in my life. Our very close neighbor was a wonderful seamstress and taught me my sewing skills. I would spend hours at her house sewing my own clothes. She was always so patient and helpful and would make me do it right. (I became the queen of rip out!). My grandmother was also very instrumental as a mentor, she could do anything creative. She never read patterns she would just look at pictures and create. She would do her beautiful hand quilting, hanging her quilt over the banister. My mother was also my mentor. She would have quilting bees at our home and do beautiful hand quilting. She always encouraged me to join in and taught me the importance of small even stitches.

### What makes the Guild important to you?

The Guild is very important to me as it is a gathering of like-minded individuals with a creative spirit. The Guild gives an opportunity to exchange ideas, learn from others and gives immense support to each other as well as the community. It challenges everyone to step up and out of their comfort zones. I feel extremely fortunate to belong to the Guild and have this available in our small community.



### Little Known Facts:

Little known facts about me, Hmmm ...... I'm very short with a giant dog. In my professional life, I was a nurse.

I am also a self taught mixed media artist. I love anything and everything creative. You name it I have tried it. I love to learn new techniques. Several years ago I had stopped creating . My wise mother told me "you

must create as you have that creative energy, if you stop and don't release that energy it will turn against you". She was so right I have learned that I must be creating or I start to lose my zest for life.


#### **RECAP OF ACTIVITIES FROM MARCH 25, 2023 RESOURCE DAY**







What Is Slow Fashion?

Think of the clothes in your closet. How many of these garments do you expect to be wearing in another five, ten years?
