MEMBER OF THE MONTH-Myrla Bulman

Each month your newsletter editor features one member. Do you have suggestions for people to be featured?

This month it is my pleasure to feature another new member and our new Web Author: Myrla Bulman

She answered these questions:

How long have you lived on the Sunshine Coast? If not forever, what brought you here?

We relocated to Sechelt from Calgary in 2021 to be closer to our girls who were born in the Lower Mainland and have returned for university. We have enjoyed our Shuswap Lake cabin since the 1960s so I always felt like BC was home too.

Since our move I've evolved back to self-employment, for more time with friends, my sewing machine, and being in the community!

When and why did you start?

I studied Textiles & Design at university and have always loved fabrics and colour; the precision of quilting and using cottons, especially batiks, is so appealing when a project comes together.

One daughter requested a quilt for university (it became my first, and her 2019 graduation gift!)

Mentors?

My high-school sewing teacher just passed away, and she was inspirational for all our projects (Ski suit! Winter coat! Period costumes!); if we could dream it up, she helped us

make it happen. She encouraged my love of tailoring, design planning, and attention to detail with textiles. My maternal grandmother was a very talented seamstress and quilt-maker who encouraged my early sewing years; I still have scissors she gave me and a handstitched quilt

My work colleague and friend, Andrea (Annapolis Royal, NS Quilt Guild) helped me plan and design my first (log cabin) quilt; we have just embarked on designing a second one (landscape!) quilt for the other daughter's graduation this year. So much to learn as quilting has its own language ... and new notions to explore!

What makes the guild important to you?

I joined the guild to spend time on non-work activities and finally learn more about quilting. I've found the Guild to be very inviting and the friendliest group I've encountered on the coast!

The Guild is part of the visual arts community and creates comfort quilts for families, making it easy to volunteer (as Webmaster) to help make the coast a great place to live.

Little known facts?

I used to be a gas jockey for my father's service station where all family members worked for many years. That job taught me a lot about customer service, cash handling, self-employment, family, work ethic, ... and how to know when a car 'just doesn't sound right!'

- Outside of Resource Days you must contact Darlene Finch to find out if there is space available. Once this has been confirmed then payment is required.


PAYMENT: We take cheques, cash and e-transfers at treasurerscqg@gmail.com If you pay by e-transfer, it is a 2-part process:

Fabrics - Large Present


- 1. Background white fabric
 - •A cut 2 3" x 2 ½" rectangles
 - •B cut 1 4 ³/₄" x 2 ³/₄" rectangle (Flying Geese block)
- 2. "Gift wrap" fabric Christmas theme
 - •D cut 4 4 ¹/₂" x 5" squares
- 3. Ribbon fabric
 - •C cut 2 2 ³/₄" x 2 ³/₄" squares (Flying Geese block)
 - •E cut 2 1 ¹/₂" x 4 ¹/₂" rectangles
 - •F cut 1 1 ¹/₂" x 10 ¹/₂" rectangle


Fabrics – Small Present

1. Background – white fabric

(does not have to be the same as the large present)

- •a cut 2 2 ¹/₂" x 2" rectangles
- •b cut 1 3 ¹/₂" x 7 ¹/₂" rectangle
- •c cut 1 4 ³/₄" x 2 ³/₄" rectangle (Flying Geese block)
- 2. "Gift wrap" fabric Christmas theme
 - •f cut 2 3 ¹/₂" x 7 ¹/₂" rectangles
- 3. Ribbon fabric
 - •d cut 2 2³/₄" x 2³/₄" squares (Flying Geese block)
 - •e cut 1 1 ¹/₂" x 7 ¹/₂" rectangle





Instructions:

- 1. Seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ ".
- 2. Both present blocks use the same Flying Geese unit to create the bow.
 - •Large Present uses pieces B and C
 - a. on the wrong side of both C pieces, draw a diagonal line from corner to
 - corner (this is the *fold* line)
 - b. place one C piece right side down on piece B
 - c. sew just beside the guideline, towards the seam allowance side (the fabric will
 - be able to fold up and over the thread and reach the edges of the unit)
 - d. trim leaving a 1/4" seam allowance, press
 - e. repeat steps b d for the second piece **B**
 - f. trim the unit to 2 ¹/₂" x 4 ¹/₂" (keep the point in the middle of the unit)
 - Small Present the above steps using pieces c and d.

3. Large Present

- •sew an A piece to each side of the Flying Geese unit, press
- •sew a D piece to each short side of an E piece, press. Make 2.
- •sew one of the DED units to one of the long sides of the F piece, press, repeat
- with the other **DED** unit, press
- •sew the bow row to the bottom piece, press.

4. Small Present

- •sew an a piece to each side of the Flying Geese unit, press
- •sew a **f** piece to each long side of the **e** piece, press
- •sew the bow section to the gift section, press
- •sew the **b** piece to the top of the bow, press.


Quilt Raffle

Cold Shelter Quilt Donations





Special question to be answered during <u>newsletter report:</u>

Who were the recipients of the Comfort quilts pictured?

HISTORY

1982 a group of women on the Sunshine Coast got together to share their love of quilting. Pat Crucil, an accomplished quilter and teacher, established this first quilt group on the Coast.
