Lots of things to see and do when you come to the **OCTOBER 2024** meeting! We do have some "mini notebooks" for sale-these make great Christmas gifts, small enough to have in your car or purse etc. Profit goes to the Program budget. Cost is \$10. Please swing by the program table to take a look.

Registration is going well for our workshops-please take a look at the website and see if there is a class you are interested in before it sells out. Reminder is that your program schedules workshops with a goal to "break even" which has allowed us to keep our costs as low as possible, however, we do need to fill classes.

October workshops include October 5th (event #25-14-indicates class number on the website) a Julie Faulkner workshop (at Chaster House, 1549 Ocean Beach Esplande, Gibsons)-helping attendees with complex patterns-whether that is a paper piecing Quiltworx pattern or a ByAnnie pattern-she is quite knowledgeable about these instructions and is helping many members complete projects that have been stalled for many a year. Cost is \$62. (non-members \$77)

October 17th (event #25-13) Sew Day for the Quilt Show (Eric Cardinal Hall, 930 Chamberlain Rd, Gibsons)-we will be working on making full size notebook covers. This is a fund raiser for your program department and will be sold at the 2025 Quilt Show boutique. If you can come and sew or cut/press for the day that would be awesome. Cost \$10

Note that the pattern is on the website for those who cannot come to the event but would like to participate and make some at home. We have purchased many notebooks to go inside the covers so we do need lots of covers to be made.

October 27th (event #25-02)) a Julie Faulkner workshop (at ECH)-this is a ruler Free motion class. Using rulers on your domestic machine. Cost \$62 (non-members \$77)

Continuing our **Fat Quarter (FQ)** draw. Please bring a **FQ** that has the colourway starting with the letter "D". That FQ is registered into a draw, and you have a chance to win them all!

At 10:00 am we will meet at a side table for a **DISCUSSION ON QUILT SHOW** rules. We expect the discussion to last 30-45 minutes.



For the 2024/25 Guild Year, I am excited to introduce the **President's Challenge - "Upcycling"** a project of your choice to inspire your creativity.

Garments, bags, quilts, art pieces are all eligible. Let your imagination go wild!

At least 60% of your project must be of non-new supplies. "Non new" supplies are things that were something else prior to this project. For example, a bag or garment found in a thrift store that you revamp, embellished, etc. . or from which you salvaged fabric and or hardware. The remaining 40% of your project can be composed of never before sewn fabric, whether new or from your stash, new hardware etc.

Points will be awarded for using biodegradable or recycled material, or materials made from natural resources e.g. bamboo.

This will be judged at the quilt show so entries must be submitted by March. 30/25 as per the Quilt show deadline.

An exciting element to this challenge isa \$200 cash prize, which has been generously donated by one of our members! The \$200 dollar prize will be awarded to the winner.

Sew into 4 rows of 4.

Using a guilting ruler and rotary cutter.

Cut the 2 bottom outside squares diagonally.

Quilt and bind as desired



Member of the Month

I am proud to introduce my friend Rojean Trent, even though she needs no introduction! She is a long time member who has held many positions and is currently, along with Donna, our new BOM committee

I have lived on the Sunshine Coast for 46 years. Came here as a young bride of 21. It wasn't until my youngest daughter was 1 years old that I joined the guild. That was in 1987. A group of crafters called Crafts Galore would have fairs selling their amazing and beautiful handmade products. They were famous here on the coast for their craft fairs. I was always a sewer and admired their work, but could never afford to buy their quilts. When I became pregnant with my oldest I really wanted one of their quilts. I had struggled with pregnancy in the beginning so had many ultra sounds. Pauline Weber was my technician and we became friends. Pauline made me my first handmade quilt and left it for me on my hospital bed after Elise was born. Such an amazing gift. I was hooked!

The guild was very small back then and we met in each others homes. We did not use rotary cutters, rulers and mats yet. All quilts were made by using plastic templates to trace around then cut out with scissors an eyeballed quarter of an inch away from the traced line. The pencil line was then used as your sewing line. I have to admit, it was a very accurate but a time consuming practice. We also hand basted every quilt together on our hands and knees on the floor of someone's kitchen. Quilts then were hand quilted with tiny needles and strong treated thread. We formed calluses on our fingers from needle pricks. I perfected hand quilting on a long frame at Pauline's house. We always helped each other with our quilts. The guild was and always has been an amazing group to belong too.

The smaller groups that have been created and formed over my years in quilting have been my mentors. When an arts group called Out of Bounds did a presentation at Resource Day many years ago now, it inspired Pushing Our Boundaries. We mentored each other while sharing the most interesting life stories. Thank you Carol Bowie, Lee Ewing, Sheila MacDonald and Eryl Shindel. I also spent many years in the Fat Quarters with mentors a plenty! We were always challenging ourselves to be better and encouraged each other.

Some facts that you might not know about me are that I was born in Flin Flon, Manitoba. I grew up in North Burnaby. I worked from age 15 at all the events on the Pacific National Exhibition Grounds. I met my husband at 15. I worked as a Special Education Teaching Assistant for over 35 years. I am CNIB certified in Braille. I retired at 60 because all I could think about at work was textile art.

So, a huge thank you to my tribe of quilters and creators. You mean so much to me.



Nancy McMurdo called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

- Motion: Karen Biddlecombe moved to accept the Executive Committee Minutes of May 28, 2024. Seconded by: Margaret Stewart Carried.
- President: Nancy McMurdo Nancy welcomed the new executive.
- Treasurer: Jane Andrews Jane is meeting with Lee on Friday to transfer the books to Jane. Once books are finalized, the BOD will then be able to finalize the budget for 2024-25. When financials are approved the final statements and budget will be sent to the membership a minimum of 2 weeks before the AGM (at Resource Day, November 30, 2024). The PDF will be put on the website in the Members Only section. Jane will let Nancy know when the budgets are ready so a zoom meeting can be set. Jane will check with the Bank to ensure the name is changed to Jane Andrews or preferably to Treasurer from the receipts that are going out to members from Treasurer@scquilteresguild.com . This e-transfer is not working internally for the people who need access to the deposit information. We are going to change internet transfers from Treasurer@scquiltersguild.com to another appropriate name to give Jane specific access to Treasurer@scquiltersguild.com and the new one to Jane and others who require the deposit information. Members will be notified with instructions and a live presentation when this happens (possibly at October RD meeting). Nancy passed around a clipboard for able members to sign up for volunteering for setup and take down at R.D. Meetings. 6 members per day. Names with dates will be in the Newsletter. Nancy will continue to search for a young group to do this for us.
- Quilt Show: Bernie Somogyi May 30 and 31st, 2025 Stitch and Bobbin is donating a sewing machine for the Quilt Show. We are working for advertising and promoting Stitch and Bobbin. There is a maximum of \$500 value. for the raffles. Karen explained the adverting for the Quilt Show for the posters. Karen will be pushing on face book and Quilt Guilds, CQA etc. This will be shareable so members can share on their Facebooks. So far, we have BC Ferries and Stitch and Bobbin as sponsored. Boutique space will be increased this year. More details to follow. Sandwich boards and posters can be updated prior to the show. Vendors will be advertised. Bernie will review the meeting date for the next Quilt Show meeting in October. We are hoping to have the volunteer signs up on the website. Stay tuned. Bernie and Myrla will work on a QR Code for the Quilt Show to send people directly to the website. Myrla will check into the exposure to keep the website safe from scammers. Hopefully this can be done in October. Nancy will send the write up for the President's Challenge to Bernie.
- CQA: Jeanette Thompson Needs to receive the CQA Newsletter. Myrla and Jeanette will meet to ensure she has the access. Jeanette will check with CQA to ensure they have the correct address. Myrla offered to give her specific training on the use of mail and the in box for CQA. Email providers are legally not allowed to send out massive emails (50 at a time otherwise considered junk mail). CQA sends out communication 100% by email. Jeanette will call Jane and Myrla re setting up CQA mail to the proper email address .(CQArep@scquiltersquild.com). Myrla and Teresa are working on a system for mass mailing to simplify the internal system for mailing.
- Membership: Janey Marshall If a member has not paid their membership (about 20), it is cancelled, but names still remain in the system. They will be able renew in the system as long as they have not changed their email. Jane will check with Teresa that a statement be put on the website and send the statement to Margaret for the Newsletter. Both statements "renew here" and "pay here" should be in instructions. By-laws and Constitution will be posted on website after November AGM.

- There are some issues re: logged in members not seeing the membership list. Myrla and Teresa are working on this. New Business: Motion: Myrla Bulman moved to review proposal to align the membership renewal term with the fiscal yearend (July 1st to June 30th) effective June 30, 2025). Part II bylaw #1 b This will be presented to the Executive for November Executive Meeting. The privacy law requires us to have a policy that states our Privacy Statement which should be developed and posted
- Technical: Myrla Myrla is working with Chris and Margaret using the app for their use. Myrla would recommend we renew the website host for 1 year to allow for the Quilt Show year and the plug ins that need to be installed for this.
